Before any trailer-towing trip, there are a number of important inspection points. Trailer safety is often overlooked as a component of successful job completion and customer satisfaction. Getting the job done fast is only a success if the job is done right - and safe.

Remember - a little time spent on safety save a lot of time (and money) wasted on accidents.



PRE-TOWING CHECKLIST

- Check gross trailer weight, tongue weight, and total weight distribution do not overload this trailer.
- Check that the correct hitch is properly installed on towing vehicle. When coupling, check that coupler locking device (safety pin), safety chains, and breakaway cable (if applicable) are properly connected.
 - The pin securing the ball mount to the receiver is intact.
 - The hitch coupler is secured.
 - Spring bar hinges are tight with the safety clips in place (load equalizer or weight distributing hitches).
 - Safety chains are properly attached.
- 3. Check that tires are properly inflated and that wheel nuts are properly torqued. If applicable, check that all lights are working properly.
 - The electrical plug is properly installed.
